


Lipsa Pradhan, class 10, Govt. High School, Kamgaon, Odisha

A device to collect Mahua flower from ground

There are many Mahua (*Madhuca longifolia* (J.Konig) (J.F Macbr)) trees in her village and she used to watch her mother and other women in the village pick up fallen Mahua flowers on the ground under the trees. Mahua flowers have many medicinal properties and these delicious flowers are also used to make pickles, jams, ice creams and desserts.
